## Newsletter April 2009...

### Message from the Vice President

Refugee settlement in Lismore has been the primary focus of Sanctuary Northern Rivers for the past 5 years. We have now assisted nearly 100 individuals to arrive and settle into our community.

On the whole, these families have arrived at a slow but steady rate of 3 or 4 families per year often after a long period of waiting (in some cases up to 2 years) from when they first were told their claim for a humanitarian visa was considered legitimate.

Recently, we have seen the numbers of applicants assessed as eligible for referral to the next stage (involving identity and medical checks) rise significantly.

This places us in a dilemma. In the past we did not make any distinction between applicants seeking sponsorship but agreed to sponsor all who could put together the paperwork Immigration required. Now, both the rise in demand for sponsorship, and the recent level of approvals mean we are no longer sure we can extend this support to everyone who asks. We are concerned that we do not have the capacity in terms of trained supporters to extend the support settlement requires, and we wonder to what extent the community has the capacity to absorb new arrivals in terms of accommodation, services and jobs.

Somehow we must find a way a way forward, whether it be extending our

limited resources or making choices – difficult choices between applicants. But whatever we do, we want to continue to extend the hand of welcome to new arrivals without jeopardising the community goodwill that exists for settlement.

To maintain integrity in the community, any decisions on settlement policy must be open, transparent and withstand public scrutiny. To achieve this we need to determine what approach to adopt that has the support of our community whilst maintaining our humanitarian ideals.

For this reason, **Sanctuary Northern Rivers is hosting a public forum on the issues of refugee settlement in Lismore on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May at 7 pm in the Lismore City Hall.** Our goal is to engage you and the community on this issue so that we can continue to work within the goodwill this community has for refugees and refugee settlement. To do otherwise would be to abrogate the responsibility this community has imbued in us as its lead organisation for refugee settlement – something we value highly and do not wish to lose.

Please put this date in your diary, tell your friends and work colleagues and encourage all who can to come along and be a part of this forum.
